



peony bare roots

Peonies are a wonderful investment for your garden. We love them for their elegance in a vase or as showstoppers in a landscape.

They make excellent cut flowers with their large, luscious blooms as well as sturdy stems. However, growing peonies can take time. With bare roots, your plant should be happy and healthy in its first year and continue to provide blooms for years to come!

Here are some tips for planting your peony bare roots:

- Plant roots in the spring. (Can also be planted in the fall before the ground freezes)
- Roots need lots of space. Plant 2"-4" deep and spaced 24" apart. The eyes of the roots should be close to the surface.
- Plant them somewhere with full sun or partial shade.
- Typical hardiness zones for peonies are Zones 3-8 (Champaign-Urbana is in Zone 6a)
